

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Year 4. The children bounced in ready for their learning and have settled into their new classroom. Our theme this term is 'The Romans and Life in Roman Britain' and below are some details.

History – We will be finding out about the Romans and life in Roman Britain.

English – We will be writing legends, focussing on Romulus and Remus, and describing a setting. The main books we will use this half term are 'Orchard Book of Roman Myths' and 'Escape from Pompeii'. We will be reading about the Celts, the Romans and Pompeii for our whole class reading and reading responses.

Grammar, punctuation, handwriting and spelling: Each week we will also have grammar and punctuation, handwriting and spelling sessions. The handwriting and spelling sessions will link with the words the children bring home to practise spelling.

Maths

Place value: We will be exploring four-digit numbers from 1,000 to 10,000 and using our understanding of what the different digits are worth to understand number sequences and patterns.

Column addition and subtraction: We will be developing our skills by adding and subtracting two four-digit numbers.

Area and perimeter: We will be making and comparing the area of shapes using squares, using metres and kilometres to measure and compare, and finding the perimeter of shapes.

Times tables: Please keep helping your child practise these at home. From time to time, they will be bringing specific tables home to learn and, in the summer term, the children will sit an online times table test.

Religious Education (RE) – We will be finding out about the Jewish celebration of Shabbat.

Science – We will be learning about solids, liquids and gases and how substances can change state between these through melting, freezing, boiling, evaporation and condensation. We will also be explaining the water cycle.

Spanish – We will be learning words to describe ourselves, numbers, days of the week, months of the year and classroom objects. We will also be following simple classroom instructions.

Personal, Social, Health and Moral Education (PSHME) – We will be thinking about being good learners, respecting ourselves and others, and challenging stereotypes.

ICT – We will be exploring computing systems and how networks connect.

Music – We will be listening to, singing and using xylophones to play music by the pop group Abba.

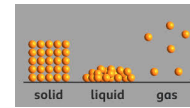
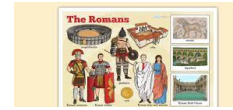
DT – We will be evaluating soups and creating our own recipes linked to Italy and the Romans.
