Safeguarding at Brindishe Manor

We also ask our staff to be vigilant in ensuring that nobody from outside school is talking to the children and they will speak to the people involved and inform the school. We know it is lovely when you walk past to see your child at play or learning with their friends, but we do ask that you do not encourage them to come over to say hello as the adults supervising do not always know who familiar adults are and other children can find it confusing.

We thank you for your support with this and in helping got keep our children safe while in school.

It is important to talk to your child about adverts and to think about what they are clicking on before they do and if they are unsure to either ignore them or to check with a trusted adult.

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 12 (respect for the views of the child): Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.

Article 12 says that every child has the right to express their views freely and that their views should be taken into account when decisions are made.

In Brindishe Schools, we have lots of **pupil leadership groups** which are beginning to take shape. These groups help pupils share their views and opinions on school life.
