# Parent Governors are Brindishe WHAT IS A PARENT GOVERNOR?

Parent Governors are Brindishe parents or carers who have been elected by the parent communities of the three schools. Our constitution allows us to have two Parent Governors. Their job is not to raise issues or grievances on behalf of the parent community, but instead to be typical or representative parents, seeing things through the eyes of a parent or carer, and providing the parental voice on the Governing Body, which itself is there to discuss and debate issues important to the safety and running of the schools, oversee and approve the budgets and finances, and support the senior leaders of all three schools in providing the very best education for all our children.

It's an important role and it does require a willingness to get involved, and give time and effort. As well as the Governing Body meetings which are held twice a term, we also have working parties to discuss particular issues in more detail, and we ask each governor to lead on a specific priority area from the school development plan.

We will be shortly running Parent Governor elections, please think about whether this could be a role for you.
