Dear Parents and Carers,

This week I am very upset and saddened to tell you that the school premises was broken into over the weekend. On Sunday, we know that at least 2 people broke into the property, took expensive items from the house and pulled out water pipes made from lead, causing it to flood. They then proceeded to climb onto the Nursery roof and strip the lead from the roof, leaving the roof exposed to the wet weather. This has meant that our Nursery needed emergency repairs as a temporary measure until we can have it repaired.

The school house, which sits at the end of Leahurst Road, has recently had a number of weeks of renovations (including a new floor and decoration as well as a roof repair). The plan is that we will be able to use this house as our Mental Health and Wellbeing hub, which has all been funded by the PSFA.

I know that you will understand how shocked and upset we all are. This will be a costly repair and it is so upsetting to know that people feel able to take from a school without any concern for the financial and educational impact this has.
