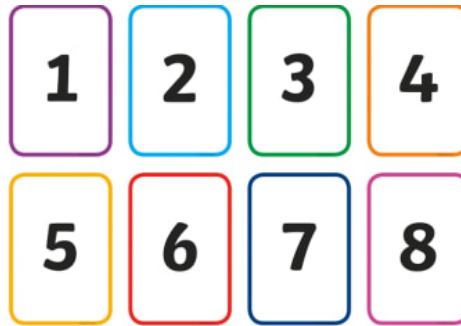


Maths Home Learning

We have been working on comparing and ordering numbers up to 10,000 this week. Why not have a go at practising this at home? You could use digit cards or make your own by writing numbers on post-it notes or pieces of paper.

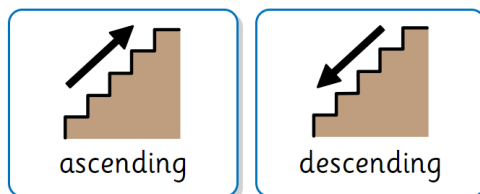


Then, make 2 numbers with them and decide which is greater or smaller. You could write it out like this:

$$5438 < 8453$$

$$8453 > 5438$$

Next, make four numbers and put them in order. You can choose to do this in ascending or descending order.



$$2349, 3492, 4293, 9234$$

or

$$9234, 4293, 3492, 2349$$

Alternatively, you can create number challenges for your family to solve e.g.

Using only the digits 7, 8, 5 and 2, can you solve this problem?

$$65_6 > _431$$

3  + 3  
3 adjective and 3 action sentences

We have been learning to write descriptively by using 3 adjectives or 3 verbs in a sentence to add detail. Why not have a go at home? You could:

Find an interesting picture (in a book, magazine, on a poster, anywhere!)



Describe what you can see by this:

focusing on 3 adjectives like

The kitchen was **chaotic**, **noisy** and **roasting hot**.

Or describe what is happening by focusing on the verbs you use e.g.

Tranio **rushed** into the chaotic kitchen, **shouting wildly** for Livia, **wondering** what on earth was happening.

Remember to include 2 commas and the conjunction 'and' to separate your ideas.

Alternatively, you could create a short cartoon of your own to describe using your adjectives and interesting verbs.
