

Article 2 – Non-discrimination
The Convention applies to every child without discrimination.

Brindishe Weekly Online Safety Bulletin

How old is your child online?

Has your child (or you on their behalf) signed up to access social media/or a game online but have said that they are older than they are so they can have an account?

For example, did your 8-year-old join TikTok and put their age as 13 or did you create their account and put your own age? If so, please read some of the implications outlined below that you should think about.

If TikTok thinks your child is 13 when they join but they are in fact 8, then by the time your child reaches 13, the app will think they are 18. This puts your child at risk of viewing content that is not age appropriate and may mean your child will view adverts aimed at adults.

In addition, now the app thinks your child is an adult, they will have access to all functionalities (whereas some apps place restrictions on access to under 18s for example to direct messaging).

Secondary Offer Day – Wednesday 1st March 2023

When you will get your offer

Online applications

If you applied on time using the online system for admission in 2023, you will get an email after 5pm on 1 March 2023 telling you where your child has been offered a secondary school place.

Paper applications

If you applied using a paper application, Lewisham will send your result by first class post on 1 March 2023. This may take a couple of days to arrive.

If your child is not offered one of the schools you applied for, and you are unable to contact Lewisham by telephone, please email secondaryadmissions@lewisham.gov.uk and include 'Secondary transfer 2023 – allocated place' in the subject line.

How to accept your place

If you applied online, you need to accept the place on the **Eadmissions website**.

If you completed a paper application, you should return your completed acceptance form to secondaryadmissions@lewisham.gov.uk and use 'Secondary transfer 2023 Acceptance' in the subject line.

You must accept your place by Wednesday 15 March 2023.

If you have not been offered any of the schools you applied for

Unfortunately, Lewisham can't offer every child a place at a school they applied for. However, they do make sure they offer every child who lives in the borough a school place.

If you live in the borough and Lewisham can't offer you a place at any of the schools on your list, they will offer you a place at your nearest Lewisham school that has a vacancy. This could be a faith or non-faith school.

Dear Parent or Guardian,

We are running a **Read for Good Readathon** and we'd love your child to join in.



It's been proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives (OECD, 2002).

The charity **Read for Good** encourages children to read through its unique motivational approach that inspires reluctant readers to give reading a go and keen readers to read more widely. Pupils can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audiobooks to blogs - they are not being assessed, it's all about reading for fun! And, they are motivated to read because the money they raise in sponsorship helps to provide a regular supply of brand new books and a resident storyteller to every major children's hospital in the UK.

The evidence from other schools is clear: teachers, parents and pupils all say that the freedom to choose what to read, combined with the knowledge that they are directly helping children in hospital, makes participation easy and compelling.

All you have to do is:

- 1. **Take a look at what they plan to read,** or help them complete their list of books to read. Remember they can read whatever they want: books, e-books, poetry, comics anything goes! Sharing books is fine too (in fact recommended!) as well as listening to audio books.
- 2. **Help your child find sponsors among family and friends**. The easiest way to sponsor a child is at https://readathon.my.salesforce-sites.com/sponsor (which family and friends can use too) or return the sponsor card with a cheque(s) or cash sent to school.

Please support your child's sponsored read as much as you can. They'll be helping kids in hospitals get books, as well as helping themselves, and our school receives free books worth 20% of our grand sponsorship total, so there really is something in it for everyone.
