#### Transition arrangements for end of the year

In 2-3 weeks' time, the children will begin their transition towards the end of the year and for the start of their new year. ## What's in the news?

#### Real or Fake?

A lot of children see or hear news updates from social media or via friends so it's important that we talk to them about fake news and provide them with the skills to help them distinguish between real or fake news. So how do we get them to critically think about what they are reading? Here are some tips:

Check the source (who wrote it).

- > When was it written? Is it based on an old story?
- Is it on a reputable news site, for example Newsround?
- You can also use 'fact checker' sites such as <a href="https://fullfact.org/">https://fullfact.org/</a> to see if the news item has already been fact checked and linked to a credible source.

### Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools – Article of the week

#### Article 10 (family reunification)

Governments must respond quickly and sympathetically if a child or their parents apply to live together in the same country. If a child's parents live apart in different countries, the child has the right to visit and keep in contact with both of them.

### Article 22 (refugee children)

If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.

# World Refugee Day

World Refugee Day is an international day designated by the United Nations to honour refugees around the globe.

It falls each year on June 20 and celebrates the strength and courage of people who have been forced to flee their home country to escape conflict or persecution.

'Refugee Week' occurs at the same time as World Refugee Day and is a UK-wide festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary.

### What events may lead to children and their families becoming refugees?

- Natural disasters like floods, hurricanes, earthquakes, tsunamis, volcanic activity, snow storms or bushfires.
- Drought or famine which leads to lack of food and water.
- War and conflict.
- Climate change. Changes in weather may affect children's access to food, water and education.
- Discrimination around race, religious beliefs, sex, nationality, or political beliefs.
- Civil unrest in a country making people feel unsafe.
- Poverty or loss of income.
- Family disputes or problems.

Paddington Bear was a refugee. Read some of his story at home with your child or watch the Paddington film and then discuss how you think Paddington felt when he was in the lifeboat after leaving Aunt Lucy in Peru or how he felt being at the train station on his own. How do you think he felt when he met the Brown family?
