Dear Parents and Carers

This week all the children from Reception to Y6 took part in the NSPCC 'Speak out. Stay safe' Workshop. Ms. Dougan ran the NSPCC online assemblies for children across the school to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child-friendly way.

Children were taught to speak out if they are worried about anything, using the systems we have in place at school. This includes their class teachers, TAs, lunchtime play leaders or other trusted adults and they were also given information about to access Childline. Following our assemblies, trained members of the NSPCC team came in to deliver workshops for our Year 5 and Year 6 children.

Throughout the year, we also use our assemblies and PSHME time to provide children with information about how to speak out and stay safe and how they can get help when needed.

School development Focus for Spring Term

At the start of the year, the senior leadership team work closely to generate our key priorities for improving standards across the school. This can be focusing on particular subject areas, styles of teaching, resources to support teaching, CPD for staff and many more. This term we wanted to share with you that our key focus is on writing and improving the outcomes for children by the end of Key Stage 2. We want more children to feel confident to plan, edit and redraft their own writing and feel proud of their final pieces. We will be focusing on the writing process and opportunities to develop vocabulary. Our staff have now been part of two CPD sessions on process and planning and different styles of writing support for children. We look forward to sharing the children's writing books with you at our open classroom this half term and parents' evening next half term.


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Brindishe Website is now LIVE!

Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 2 - The Convention applies to every child without discrimination

Article 19 - Protection from violence, abuse and neglect

Article 37- No child should be tortured, sentenced to death, imprisoned unfairly or treated in a cruel or inhuman way

Article 38- No child under 15 should join the army and children should be protected in war



Holocaust Memorial Day is on the 27th January every year.

27th January marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. On this day we remember the six million Jewish people who were killed during the Holocaust, alongside millions of other people who were killed under Nazi persecution and in genocides that followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

Holocaust Memorial Day is for everyone. Each year across the UK, thousands of people come together to learn more about the past and take action to create a safer future. We know they learn more, empathise more and do more.

Children & staff at Brindishe Schools discuss prejudice and discrimination that happen today and that have happened in the past as part of our school curriculum. We discuss how we 'speak up' and how we make everyone feel welcome in our schools.

Instagram

Is your child on Instagram?
You should be over 13 years of age to set up an account.

Instagram is used to post photos and videos. Users can also DM (direct message), send disappearing messages, add to their stories (these disappear after 24 hours) and broadcast live.

Instagram have now introduced new age verification software to help confirm the age of users. Any user who tries to change their age will have to upload an ID document or take a video selfie.

Brindishe Green is one of 3 schools in the Brindishe federation and works closely with Brindishe Manor and Brindishe Lee.

We are a very friendly team, working in a highly supportive environment where individual differences are welcome and teamwork is highly valued.
