Playtime Update:

Children in years 1-6 spend 20% of their week at 'play' through their morning playtime and lunchtime. Another key focus for us over the past year or so has been to find ways to support children's playtimes through the resources they have access to, the space they can use and the activities on offer.

Our PSFA have already funded our training room furniture and resources which the children use each lunchtime for a quiet space. They have also supported with the purchase of physical resources such as balls and cones, bats and beanbags.

The next stage of our plan is underway to provide children with large spare parts, such as tyres, wooden planks, crates, fabrics, mud kitchens and so on for them to develop their play opportunities. Brindishe Manor Science Week 5th – 9th June

Whole School Home Learning Challenge!

This year's theme is:





Our annual Science Home Learning Challenge will take place next half term during Science Week. Entries have to be in on **Tuesday 6th June**. This year's theme is Float. We know some Year groups will have done Float in previous years but this is a great opportunity to improve on your previous designs! The finals will be between Y5 and 6, Year 3 and 4, and Year 1 and 2. Early Years will have their own final.

There will be certificates for:

- Most successful project (EYFS/KS1 does it float? KS2 which entry can hold the heaviest weight?)
- Most original design
- Most effort

During science week, there will be a competition in your child's class to choose which ones will go to the final. The children in the science team will judge the finals and the winners from the finals will share their projects in whole school assemblies at the end of science week.

All projects will be out in the classrooms on Friday after school so parents, carers and children can look at them all.

Rules:

- You can buy the materials to make it with but you can't bring in something that is ready made.
- It can be a joint project with a friend but remember it is a home project.
- Everyone at home can get involved and help but don't do it all. It's their project!

We can now confirm that London Borough of Lewisham will use a further allocation of the 'Household Support Fund' to support families with FSM eligible children by providing vouchers for the half term. The available funding means Lewisham can assist these families at a rate of £15 per eligible child.

Emergency SOS calls

You can set up emergency SOS calls on your iPhone/Android, so it calls the emergency services even when you phone is locked. Here's how to set it up:

iPhone

At the same time, press and hold the side button and either volume button until the sliders appear. Once the countdown on Emergency SOS ends, release the buttons. You can also enable iPhone to start Emergency SOS when you press the side button five times.

Android

Press the power button five times or more. A five-second countdown begins before emergency services are called.





Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools – Article of the week

Article 15 - Freedom of Association

Every child has the right to meet with other children and to join groups and organisations, as long as this does not stop other people from enjoying their rights. Article 15 is about the right of association which is having the opportunity to gather with others for different purposes.

Why is important that young people should have the opportunity to meet, spend time together and share ideas?

- Joining groups or organisations can help us learn more about different issues.
- Meeting others helps us develop new skills: how to resolve issues, find ways to compromise, share, encourage, show support and empathy.
- It helps us to learn from and mix with a range of other people.
- We can learn a lot from other children and young people that helps to form our views and opinions about different things.
- By being with other people, we learn more about ourselves.
- People can be stronger together.
- Joining together as a group, we can bring about change.
- Young people have a right to participate and to be listened to and be heard.

If your child belongs to a few different clubs and/or groups – what's the difference between them? Are some just for fun? Do others help them to learn new skills? Do others help to make a difference or change something in your school or local community?

Take some time with your child to think about time with others.

Why is it good to meet up? What's important about belonging?

How can you help to make others feel that they are welcome and really belong to groups you are part of?

How can you show appreciation for what others bring to groups you are in? Who are the duty bearers who help to make your groups happen? How could you thank them?
