Rights Respecting at Brindishe Schools - Article of the Week

Article 13 (freedom of expression)

Sharing Thoughts Freely

Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

At Brindishe we think it's important that children and young people are able to express their thoughts, ideas and opinions freely.

- Their views matter.
- Free expression helps good conversation and discussion.
- Many thoughts and ideas can lead to a better world.
- Children have some great ideas that adults might never think of.
- It helps to prepare them for adulthood.
- Adults have this right so children should have it too,
- It helps children and young people to feel valued.
- Involving young people means there are more people to make a difference.
- We all have different views and experiences, so including everyone means we get lots of perspectives.
- It can help children to learn about politics and democracy.
- Children have rights!

We have many teams at school, which children lead including Rights Respecting teams, Digital Leaders and Lunchtime Buddies. Brindishe children are able to share their thoughts freely.

Online Safety with Google

As part of Google Families, Google have a hub of resources that you can use including conversation starters with links to additional tools and advice and information about parental controls.

How can the law help you?

Whilst we wait for the Online Safety Bill to be passed, which will hopefully improve Online Safety, there are certain laws already established to help protect us online.

For example, in the UK we have the Malicious Communications Act 1988 that states it is an offence to send a communication that conveys an indecent or grossly offensive message or a threat. We also have the Protection from Harassment Act 1997, which covers threatening behaviour or harassment online.

Peer recommendation shelves



Many children at Brindishe Manor love reading comics and graphic novels as they are a great alternative to more traditional 'chapter books'.








There are also some great magazines in the same style – e.g. The Phoenix Magazine.


