We currently have spaces in some of our year groups!


Do you know anybody who would like to join our wonderful school?

School Street Reminder

As you are aware, all three Brindishe schools have surrounding roads that are 'School Streets'. A School Street is a road outside a school with a temporary restriction on motorised traffic at school drop-off and pick-up times. The restriction applies to school traffic and through traffic. The result is a safer, healthier and pleasant environment for everyone. This means that vehicles are not permitted to drive down these roads during drop off and pick up. **HOWEVER**, residents and some staff members are exempt from this restriction. In addition, the restrictions mean that cars cannot enter the school street BUT may leave at any time. This means that occasionally there may be vehicles driving past our schools. Please do continue to follow safety rules when crossing the roads and never presume that the road will be clear. If you child walks to and from school alone, please reinforce the importance of safe crossing with them. Thank you.

Right Respecting Article Of The Week

Parental Responsibility

Article 5 (parental guidance and a child's evolving capacities): Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents and carers to provide guidance and direction to their child as they grow up, so that they fully enjoy their rights. This must be done in a way that recognises the child's increasing capacity to make their own choices.

Article 18 (parental responsibilities and state assistance): Both parents (or legal guardians) share responsibility for bringing up their child and parents and carers should always consider what is best for the child. Governments must support parents and legal carers by creating support services for children and giving parents the help they need to raise their children.

Articles 5 and 18 are all about the job of parents and carers in the upbringing of children and young people.

What are some of the important things that carers and parents do for children?

- ·Provide you with a home.
- ·Care for you and show you love.
- ·Provide food and clothes.
- ·Set you a good example.
- ·Help you to become independent.
- ·Give you emotional support.
- ·Support your learning and going to school.
- ·Make sure you have opportunities to be fit and healthy.
- ·Prepare you for adult life.
- ·Share their culture and identity and beliefs and values with you.
- ·Allow you to be yourself.
- ·Help you to enjoy all of your rights!



Parents and carers have a right to support from the government to help them bring up their children. Governments often provide this help through the council or through charities. <u>Home Start</u> is one example of charity support for families.
