



What happened in school this week?

This week we started our Neurodiversity fortnight with the children. On Monday we talked about tics and twitches and how these are involuntary movements and sounds. We explored when these might happen for some people and when they can increase for some children. On Wednesday Mrs Caller talked to the children about differences in the way we learn and read the story *Thunder Boots* by Naomi Jones and Rebecca Anderson to all of the children. She linked this to our 5 school values.



This week our Year 4 have spent 3 days and 2 nights on their residential visit in Surrey. They had the opportunity to undertake some field work, teamwork and develop their problem solving skills. They took part in den building in the woods, pond dipping, orienteering, a long evening walk and a whole host of other activities. The children all had a great time. Thank you to all of the school adults who volunteered their time to support the children on this visit.

Easter Holiday Vouchers

The London Borough of Lewisham has confirmed that it is able to support families with FSM (Free School Meal) eligible children by providing vouchers for the Easter Holidays.

The available funding means they can assist these families at a rate of £30 per eligible child. Families will receive a supermarket voucher provided by an extension to the Household Support Fund via London Borough of Lewisham and your school.

From Thursday 7th March, families who are on benefit related free school meals should receive a HAF Holiday Voucher from Holiday Activities. Redeeming this voucher will credit your account with 4 credits that can be used to book free activities over the holiday period for 4 hours per day, 4 days a week. Food will be provided along with fruit and snacks.

Please be aware that activities are booked on a first-come, first-served basis so keep an eye out for an email or text message containing a HAF voucher and be sure to browse the available activities.

Right Respecting Article Of The Week

Article 14 (freedom of thought, belief and religion)

Every child has the right to think and believe what they choose and also to practise their religion, as long as they are not stopping other people from enjoying their rights. Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents to guide their child as they grow up.

Fortnite Battle Royale

Fortnite Battle Royale is rated PEGI 12 because it features moderate violence which means it is not suitable for persons under 12 years of age. It is important to remember that when rating games, PEGI do not take into consideration the communication features of a game. Fortnite does include a chat facility, which adds further risks.

What is Fortnite?

There are different versions of Fortnite, including Battle Royale, which is free to play (although in-app purchases are available). In Battle Royale up to one hundred players compete against each other.

What do I need to be aware of?

- Chatting to strangers and inappropriate language: Fortnite contains voice and text chat. Due to the nature of the game, your child may be chatting to strangers and may hear inappropriate language. Ensure your child knows how to report players for any inappropriate behaviour.
- In app purchases: All users can purchase V-Bucks directly through the game so make sure you don't store your card details within the game/device and restrict purchases.

Parental Controls

Fortnite includes several parental controls to help you make it a safer environment for your child including disabling voice chat, filtering language, and setting privacy settings. Also, remember to set up age-appropriate parental controls on the device your child is playing on.
