# What has been happening this week?

It's been another busy week throughout the school, with children enjoying a range of visitors and going on trips to support their learning.

On Tuesday, Year 5 welcomed a Benin workshop to school to support their History learning about West Africa. On Wednesday, Year 3 visited the Church of the Good Shepherd on Handen road for a tour of the church and to develop their learning on Christianity. Y4 visited the Synagogue in Bromley on Thursday as they have learnt about Shabbat and special Jewish festivals. Finally, Year 5 and 6 took part in a 'Powerful choices' workshop, which explored the risks and choices that they can make as they travel more independently and transition to secondary school.

Please can we remind all children and parents/carers of our policy on jewellery: we do not allow jewellery in school, apart from religious items such as a crucifix or a Kara (Sikh bangle), and only close-fitting stud earrings, never hooped or dangly earrings.

We are seeing an increased number of children wearing smartwatches to school. As you know, there are many different versions that can do a variety of things (take photos, receive texts, count steps etc), and for safeguarding reasons, we ask that children only to wear a simple digital or analogue watch to school. # **Online Safety Bulletin**

#### **Get to know Age Ratings**

Age ratings are in place to help protect your child, so we thought we'd provide you with a little reminder of how important it is to check the age ratings of what your child is accessing online. Here are the age ratings of some of the more popular apps that young people are accessing.

#### Did you know that WhatsApp has an age rating of 16?

Whether your child is viewing films, accessing apps, playing games online, using social media or downloading other apps – check the age rating first to see if your child is old enough.

In addition, the likes of PEGI include further content descriptors, which will give you an indication of the type of content that your child might view e.g. violence, if accessing the app/game etc.

It is important to note that whilst age ratings do allow you to see if something may be appropriate for your child, it is also important to review the content yourself. This will allow you to make an informed decision as to whether it is suitable for your child to access and if it would be beneficial to apply further parental controls.

# Right Respecting Article Of The Week

**Article 1** makes clear that everyone under the age of 18 has all the rights in the Convention.

Article 4 states that governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

**Article 41** states that if a country has laws and standards that go further than the present Convention, then the country must keep these laws.

#### How do children get to enjoy their rights in the UK? What does Government do to make this happen?

- •Every child must be registered with a name at birth.
- •There are parks and play areas provided.
- •We have education and health care systems.
- •Some people's job is to protect children.
- •The school curriculum includes learning about the CRC (in some parts of the UK).
- •Children are given protection when they need it.
- •Most schools have ways of listening to children's views and opinions.
- •There are Children's Commissioners whose job it is to make sure children are listened to.
- •Social care services and the police work to keep all children protected.
- •In Scotland, the CRC is being incorporated into law.
- •Many schools are UNICEF UK Rights Respecting Schools and children learn about their rights.
- •There are laws which include some rights from the CRC, such as equalities legislation and the Children Act.

All children are special and important, and governments have to do all they can to make sure that each child enjoys their rights. Read the book Every Child a Song by Nicola Davies and Marc Martin and discuss what makes your child special. At Brindishe Schools we celebrate every child's uniqueness and discuss what makes them

special.

Brindishe Green is a community school where learning together is seen as a very important part of the education that we offer. We are a very friendly team, working in a highly supportive environment where individual differences are welcome and teamwork is highly valued. The school is arranged on three floors with our youngest children on the ground floor. Though the building might look traditional, we use it in a modern way. Each class uses their own classroom and a range of shared areas outside of this environment depending on the curriculum area or the type of learning in which they are involved. You might imagine this creates a lot of noise as children move around our large building. In fact it doesn't – Brindishe Green is a very quiet and calm school. Children learn in a calm and considerate way and behave responsibly.

At Brindishe Green we are looking for applicants who have experience of working with primary school aged children and their families. We are looking for a well-educated, flexible and confident person who is looking for a role in which they can make a real difference to the lives of our children and their families. Knowing our families and how best we can support is the key to making this role a success.


## Coffee morning - Friday 23rd Feb, 8.45am.
