### **Rights Respecting Article Of The Week**

#### Introducing Article 6 (life, survival and development)

Every child has the right to life. Governments must do all they can to ensure that children survive and develop to their full potential.

#### What are all the things that you need to survive and to develop?

- ·Good health physical and mental
- ·Education
- ·Healthy food
- ·Clean water
- ·Somewhere safe to live
- ·People to look after you

 $\cdot A$  name and an identity so you can be registered for healthcare and education

- ·Protection so you are safe from abuse and neglect
- ·A good standard of living
- ·Time and space to relax and play
- ·Knowledge of your rights

Article 6 talks about developing to your full potential and surviving; other words that are sometimes used are 'flourish' and 'thrive'. At home with your child, look up the definitions of these words – do they all mean the same thing?

### **Online Safety Bulletin**

**Talking to younger children** - It is never too early to start chatting to our children about how to stay safe online. But how can we do this? Here are some of our suggestions:

#### Use books to spark conversations

Childnet have created a collection of five 'Digiduck' stories to help you educate your child (aimed at aged 3–7) about online safety.
