
#### **Book Amnesty**

Please send in any reading books that belong to the school. We need to do a stock take before ordering new books.


We will have a special Leaver's Assembly on Tuesday where we will say goodbye to Year 6 and our staff members who are moving on.

**Holiday Vouchers and Programme** 

London Borough of Lewisham will once again this summer use an allocation of the 'Household Support Fund' to support families with FSM eligible children by providing vouchers for the summer holiday, 2025. The available funding means Lewisham can assist these families at a rate of £90 per eligible child for this holiday. You will receive your vouchers by *Friday 18*<sup>th</sup> *July*.

Lewisham will also run its Holiday Programme this summer. They are really pleased to continue supporting the delivery of this programme, with many providers offering various fun-packed sessions, including arts, crafts, sports and trips that will run throughout the School Easter, Summer and Christmas holidays.

#### There will be free activities and lunches for children and young people who are:

- aged 4 to 16 years (reception to year 11)
- in receipt of benefit-related Free School Meals

#### Each club will provide:

- a wide range of exciting activities to suit different ages and personalities
- fun physical activity sessions
- free, nutritious, and tasty food

#### How to book activities

Families who receive benefit related free school meals will receive a **HAF** (**Holiday Activities and Food**) Code via email or text message. This code lets you access a webpage with details of all activities and book your child's space. Make sure you follow the link and instructions in the message. Each code is unique to each family. Families with more than one child will get a code for each child. If you haven't received a HAF code and your child receives, benefit related free school meals, or if you require any support with bookings, contact **HAF Programme** - https://lewisham.gov.uk/myservices/young-people/holiday-programme-food-and-fun.

# Online Safety Bulletin - Artificial Intelligence (AI)

#### What is AI?

Al is when a computer/machine can learn and perform tasks like a human. Its popularity continues to increase, and examples include:

- Virtual assistants like Alexa and Siri.
- Chatbots such as ChatGPT and My AI from Snapchat

#### **Potential Risks of AI?**

- Chat apps A simple search of "Al Chat" within the App store highlights the number of apps already available and just scrolling through, you can see that they are not suitable for children with many rated as 17+.
- Image manipulation there are AI tools that can be used to digitally remove clothes from photos, which clearly raises serious safeguarding and privacy concerns.
- Deepfakes there are also Al tools that create realistic, fake videos which can be used to spread misinformation or cause harm.

Lewisham is holding its annual transfer to secondary school event and they are asking schools to encourage parents to attend. It is an informal event for parents to ask questions about the admissions process and to meet staff, parents and students from our secondary schools.

Parents can book a place at one of the school talks, to understand the application process. This will help you to be aware of the timetable and closing date for submitting your application. Each session will start with a short presentation about the process, and a Q&A with our Admissions team.
