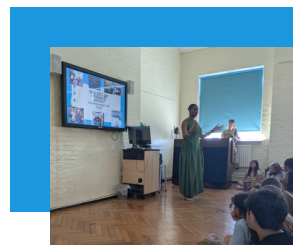

Dear Parents/Carers,

I am pleased to announce that Lewisham Council has approved an extension of our focus groups for Black and Black Mixed heritage parents and carers, delivered by SIRG. These sessions will now run through October as we move forward with Phase 2 of this initiative.

Feedback from our previous sessions highlighted the importance of providing a dedicated space for parents to share experiences, build trust and psychological safety, and foster community support. Our goal is to use these sessions to strengthen relationships between families and schools.

The purpose of these sessions is to give you a space to share your perspectives and to ensure voices from Black and Black Mixed heritage communities that may be underrepresented in research and service design are included in decision-making processes.

It would be wonderful to have you be apart of the phase 2 of the focus groups. This will be held at Brindishe Lee Tuesday 23rd June at 1pm

Rights Respecting Article

World Refugee Day

World Refugee Day is an international day designated by the United Nations to honour refugees around the globe.

It falls each year on June 20th and celebrates the strength and courage of people who have been forced to flee their home country to escape conflict or persecution.

'Refugee Week' occurs at the same time as World Refugee Day and is a UK-wide festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary.

Article 10 (family reunification)

Governments must respond quickly and sympathetically if a child or their parents apply to live together in the same country. If a child's parents live apart in different countries, the child has the right to visit and keep in contact with both of them.

Article 22 (refugee children)

If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.

Paddington Bear was a refugee. [Read some of his story](#) or watch the Paddington film and then discuss with your child at home how you think Paddington felt when he was in the lifeboat after leaving Aunt Lucy in Peru or how he felt being at the train station on his own. How do you think he felt when he met the Brown family?

If you had to flee your home suddenly, what would you take with you?



This year's theme is 'Courage' – celebrating the strength it takes to seek safety, rebuild lives, and contribute to our communities.
