

School Holiday activities at Better Leisure Centres The Better run Leisure Centre's are running a range of activities this October Half Term.





Starting reception in 2026 – advice and support for Lewisham parents will take place on:

Wednesday 12, Thursday 13, Monday 24 and Wednesday 26 November 2025 at 5pm

It is an informal event for parents/carers to ask questions about the admissions process.

Parents / carers can book a place at one of the school talks, to understand the application process, be aware of the timetable and closing date for submitting their application.

After each school talk, parents will have the opportunity to ask questions about the process.

There will also be an opportunity to meet with other Lewisham colleagues, including from Early Years, SEN and Family Navigators.

Deciding which schools to apply for The first step is to decide which schools you would like to apply for. There are many good and outstanding primary schools in the Lewisham borough. Find out about these schools and see which are nearest to you at www.lewisham.gov.uk/primaryschools.

Check if your child is likely to be offered a place at

If there are more applicants for a school than places available, we use the admissions criteria to decide who should be offered a place. The criteria vary from school to school. You should use them to find out if your child has a good chance of being offered a place at the schools you prefer.

You need to apply online at www.eadmissions.org.uk. You can apply for up to six schools, either in Lewisham or outside the borough. You must not put independent schools on your application. You must list the schools you wish to apply for in preference order. You can appl online from 1 September 2025 and must apply by the closing date on 15 January 2026.

When you will find out which scho been offered a place at

You will get an email on the evening of national offer day, Thursday 16 April 2026. It will tell you where your child has been offered a place and how to accept the offer.
