Challenge Partners Quality Assurance Review at Brindishe Manor

We were visited this week by Ofsted inspector David Cox and three senior leaders at schools from across the country in order to assess the quality of teaching and learning at Brindishe Manor School. They spoke to the children, to the staff, to our teacher leaders and to the senior leaders and observed teaching and learning in every class.

The review team were extremely impressed with what they saw and heard over the three days at our school. Their view was that Brindishe Manor has really high standards but it's 'not an exam factory' and they were delighted to see yoga, singing, beautiful art, dance and 'a highly inclusive learning environment where all children are able to thrive irrespective of their background, additional needs, circumstances or abilities'.

The children described Brindishe Manor as a place where you can 'be creative, be a leader and get involved', where 'everyone has a voice', where 'everyone has a chance', where 'diversity is important' and 'inclusion matters' and where 'everyone can feel equal and you are allowed to be who you are'.

I look forward to sharing the report with you and I will let you know when it is published on our school website.
