In class this week...

Every week we would like to share with you what each year group has been focusing on in class and offer some ideas on how you can support your child over the coming week.

In Year 1...This week we have started our new learning theme - SUPERHEROES. We have been learning about onomatopoeia words and how to use them in sentences. In Maths, we have revised numbers and their values. *At home you could......*

Have a go at writing as many onomatopoeia words you can think of e.g. plop, boom, puff. Can you identify any in of these special words in books?

You could have a go at counting different objects at home. Go on a 'number hunt', make a fruit salad and ask your child to count the pieces of fruit you use—make counting fun! Next week we will be focusing on comparing numbers using keywords more, less, greater and fewer.

In Year 2...Amethyst & Ruby Class have started Year 2 in fine form. We have been learning about the oceans and the fantastic creatures who live there through our learning theme "Wonders of the Deep".

We were visited by Dougal the Deep-Sea Diver this week and have been writing interesting descriptive sentences that we will use to help us write a diary of Dougal's adventures next week.

At home, you could...Investigate an interesting aquatic creature of your choice, finding out facts about them and the underwater habitats in which they live.

In Year 3...Year 3 have started their maths learning by looking at their knowledge of place value in maths. We have been counting in ones and tens and also using the Dienes to make larger numbers. It would be really helpful if the children continued to practice counting at home, especially crossing over to the next tens. We have also been carrying out lots of research about the Stone Age and the Iron Age. We will be using the notes from our research to write our own non-chronological reports next week.

At home you could continue to further research the Stone Age and Iron Age clothing, food and the types of homes they lived in.

In Year 4...This week in Year 4 we have been investigating numbers up to 100,000. The children have been focusing on place value and understanding the value of numbers and digits. We have introduced the children to our new learning theme, which is all about the Tudors. The children are already really keen to find out more. At home, you could make a Tudor fact sheet with your child. It would be lovely to share some in class next week.

In Year 5...

We have begun exploring the novel 'Wonder' by R J Palacio. The children spent their time looking at the feelings and opinions of characters in the novel using the 'hot seating' technique to really help their thought process. This week, the children started writing diary entries in the role of one of the main characters using many literary techniques such as rhetorical questions and emotive language. In Maths, we have been looking at numbers up to 10 million, identifying place value and comparing digits. The children have worked very hard to read and write numbers using a place value chart to check their answers.

At home you could ask your child to draw a place value chart and place a number in it for them. Can they round the number to the nearest hundred/ thousand?

In Year 6...

Year 6 have made an excellent start to term, throwing themselves into our World War 2 topic with gusto! They thoroughly enjoyed our World War 2 day, which included cracking Bletchley Park codes, performing the King's speeches, creating games to play in air raid shelters and marching to the tune of their own call-and-response chants.

If any families have any WW2 memorabilia, or have relatives who would like to come into school and speak about their experiences or those of people they knew, please let us know!
