#### In class this week...

Each week we would like to share with you what each year group has been focussing on in class and offer some ideas on how you can support your child over the coming week.

#### Reception...

In Reception this week the children have been learning to keep our environment tidy and safe using our 'Choose it, use it and put it away' rhyme. We have been playing many listening games, helping the children to listen carefully to the people around them.

At home, you could...play 'What can you hear?' where you ask your child to close their eyes and listen to all the sounds inside and outside.

### In Year 1...

This week we have been reading 'Supertato' and used drama to help us get into role and think about the characteristics of a superhero. *Please bring in up to 3 pieces of fruit or vegetables so that we can create our own superheroes next week.* In Science this term we will be learning all about the human body. *Please could children bring in a baby photo next week for our 'Guess the baby' activity.* 

If possible, please provide a colour copy so we can photocopy them at school and return the originals to you.

#### In Year 2...

Ruby and Amethyst have had such a busy week! We have been learning about different animal habitats in science. How many different marine habitats do you know about? We have also used iPads and atlases to explore the world's oceans.

At home, you could investigate one of the world's oceans or seas and create a poster filled with information about it. We are looking forward to our visit to the Horniman Museum on Monday 8th October and are very grateful to those adults who have offered to come with us; we still do need a few more volunteers!

## In Year 3...

This week year 3 have been counting in hundreds and thousands. In literacy, we have been looking at the features of formal and informal letters. We have also carried out some experiments on rocks and tested different types of to find out whether they are permeable or not. *You could continue to help your child at home with their research on The Stone Age and Iron Age?* 

## In Year 4...

This week in maths, Year 4 have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and 100. Can you think of why being able to round numbers would be a useful skill?

In Science, we have been sorting materials into groups (solids, liquids and gases), and exploring the properties of these three states of matter.

At home, you could investigate the different states of matter of food and find examples of solids and liquids that display unique properties.

## In Year 5...

This week in Year 5, we have been exploring the Kingdom of Benin and looking at how its borders have changed over time. We found modern day Benin on a World map and questioned how this has changed since 900 AD. We also delved into how the kingdom was first established and the earthen moat that was built around the kingdom.

In Science, we have started our topic 'Materials'. Children have been showing what keen scientists they are by coming up with some brilliant wonders about some everyday materials. Over this half term, the children will be creating their own experiments, completing fair tests and continuing to wonder about all things 'material'.

Why not explore some of the objects you use every day with your child and discuss why they have been built from specific materials, along with the properties of those materials.

## In Year 6...

Year 6 have written diary entries based on the Blitz bombings. We've focused on using adjectives, similes and personification for effect. We have also studied the artwork of Henry Moore and created our own chalk drawings based on his art from WW2.

Ask your child to compare Moore's artwork with Bill Brand's 'People Sheltering in the Tube, Elephant and Castle Tube Station 1942' and Edward Ardizzone's watercolour 'In the Shelter 1940'. What similarities and differences can they find between the artists' work? You can see these online!
