<u>Nursery:</u> We have been continuing our celebrations of Christmas in Nursery. The Children are working very hard in Santa's Workshop making cards, decorations and writing their names. We have been practising very hard getting everything ready for the Winter Sing-a-Long Performance on the 12th of December. Children have been learning some new songs and making their own props. We are very excited to see all the adults in the audience. Please keep practising the songs at home.

<u>Reception</u>: The children are working hard to learn the words and actions in the Winter songs for our EYFS performance on Thursday 12th December. They are really excited about performing in front of an audience on the stage.

The children have been busy making cards for each other and family members and creating art using natural resources such as pebbles, shells and leaves. We have also been exploring symmetry. The children used different shapes in their individual creations ensuring that they were the same on both sides.

We would welcome any donations of wrapping paper, tags and bows for our Elves' Workshop.

Year 1: Year 1 have been getting in the festive spirit, learning about the Christmas story and how it is celebrated. For the Christmas production, the children will need to wear black bottoms and a top (leggings/jogging bottoms and a long sleeve top), and we will be making our own headbands in class.

In maths, we are finishing our topic of subtraction with number stories. The children have been using all of the skills they have learned so far – part-part whole, counting backwards, bar modelling and creating number sentences. Try creating your own subtraction story at home and writing the matching number sentence. We have also made an area to showcase fantastic learning that the children do outside of school and bring in for

show and tell. Can we please ask that anything bought in for show and tell be linked to the learning taking place in the classroom and not items/objects that can be easily broken, damaged or lost?

Jasper class are finishing up their animal information leaflets and Onyx class their pirate stories. You are welcome to come in on Thursday 19th December when you pick up your child to see the learning they have been working so hard on.

<u>Year 2</u>: This week, Y2 have been working on writing in role. They have studied the book 'Sophie Scott goes to Antarctica' and have used drama to work out how they would feel if they did the same trip. They have begun writing their own journals based on the book. In maths, children are working on their 3 times tables and problem solving. They have also been learning about the Nativity story and all really enjoyed visiting the Good Shepherd church on Tuesday. Thanks to all the parents and carers who helped! Nativity preparations are well underway and children have been practising on the stage

<u>Year 3:</u> Year 3 thoroughly enjoyed the visit to The British Museum where they were able to use tablets to navigate their way round the Pre-historic Britain rooms to find about different artefacts. Thank you to all the adults who accompanied us on the visit. Sapphire class have been learning their 8 times table this week, we started by using concrete resources to learn them and then moved onto solving problems. In English, we have

been planning and writing an alternative ending to 'The Stone Age Boy', focusing on using adjectives to describe settings. Pearl class have been learning how to divide, we started by using concrete resources to divide and then moved onto drawing arrays to help us. In English, we have been writing non-chronological reports about the Stone Age. For the Winter Performance next week, we are asking children to wear either a red, green or a festive jumper.

Year 4: This week, Amber class have been writing poetry linked to both Hamlet and Macbeth whilst in maths we have ended the week looking more closely at the 9 times table. Please do learn <u>all</u> your tables at home, they are so important to be able to recall at speed and out of order! In Topaz class, we will soon complete Lady Macbeth's monologue and we will begin to look at instruction texts to create recipes for the witches' potions. Thank you to all the parents and carers who came to watch Y4 perform 'Macbeth'. We are so proud of all the children, they did brilliantly and had only 1 day to do so, what talent we have in our midst! What was great to see was how well they understood the play and the complex characters in it. There are more performances to come next week as the children perform in our winter performances and we hope to see you there!

<u>Year 5:</u> In year 5 this week, we are using a short story 'Alien Landing' as a starting point to create our own short story. We have started immersing ourselves into the text through reading and drama. We are trying the process of 'slow writing' to get the children to really think about the structure of each paragraph, focusing on use of conjunctions and figurative language such as similes and personification. In Maths, we have begun to convert fractions to decimals by changing the denominators to 10ths, 100ths or 1000ths, and also by using the bus stop method for division.

In our classroom reading areas, we would like to start a 'book recommendation station'. We thought it would be lovely to get families involved so if you had a favourite book as a child, could you write a short recommendation to share? If possible, we would love some pictures of families reading their favourite books to add to the display. We will then try to get copies of the books for the children enjoy. The children have also worked extremely hard on their singing for next week's Winter Performance - we look forward to seeing many of you there!

<u>Year 6:</u> Year 6 have finished publishing our biographies of Anne Frank. All of the final copies were of an exceptionally high standard, from the language used, the care taken over presentation and the powerful messages contained within. We began today, to present our work in imaginative and engaging ways; by creating, for example: audiobooks, stop-motion animations, artwork and music.

In science, we have continued to develop our understanding of electricity and how circuits work. In history, we have begun to create our presentations using *Prezi* software. In art, we have started various artist studies, looking at the work of Henry Moore among others. We have also been sharing our singing with other classes and are very excited for the Winter Performances, next week - hope you all have tickets!
