Thank you to all those parents, carers and children who made the effort to walk to school. It was pleasing to see less cars on Leahurst Road this week. It would be great to see more children biking to school next half term. Perhaps take half term to take your child out on a bike ride!

As you may be aware, Lewisham launched the *Healthy Neighbourhoods programme* in the Lewisham & Lee Green area last week. This is an ambitious programme aimed at reducing traffic cutting through our area, which will improve conditions for pedestrians, people on bikes and other vulnerable road users. All residents in the area will have received a letter through their door informing them of the project and how they can get involved. Over the next few weeks, residents can attend drop in sessions (see below), as well as sharing their views online at <u>www.streetbuilder.io</u>, to help develop the best possible designs for the area. At the end of this first engagement stage, consideration of feedback will be taken, and this will result in a proposed package of work being put forward for the area, consisting of a number of traffic management schemes that address through traffic. I ask all parents and carers to get involved for the benefit of all our children.

In class this week ...

Each week we will continue to share with you what each year group has been focusing on in class and offer some ideas on how you can support your child over the coming week.

<u>Nursery</u>

This week, we welcomed Mrs Le Roux to our class. She will be the class teacher after the half term break. She commented on how settled the children were and how confidently they lead their learning. She has had a lovely time getting to know the children and is looking forward to being with them after half term. This week, Mrs Le Roux and I have been able to finalise some dates for upcoming workshops and trips. More details are to follow nearer the time. However, we just wanted to remind you that when we have educational visits, the nursery will be closed and we will ask you to meet us at the venue. Finally, I just wanted to say a big thank you to Miss Chaudhari for making the Nursery such an amazing learning environment. The children have made huge progress during the year and I'm sure they will love the activities planned for the last half term. Reception

The children have been writing for all sorts of purposes and in all sorts of ways in Reception this week. We've had stories about animals, letters and cards to family and friends, books about dinosaurs and fairies, tickets to the Moon, registers, shopping lists....It is wonderful to see so many children writing in difficult contexts and for different reasons.

This half term, you could encourage your child to help you make a shopping list, write a birthday card or perhaps a birthday wish list, send an email or text message, do some party planning, write a recipe for their favourite food and then make it...there are so many reasons to write everyday!

Board games like Snakes and Ladders or Ludo are a great way to embed counting skills and number recognition. Why not have a board game fest at home over half term? It really encourages turn-taking too! We are sending home some 'Wow' cards for families to share special learning moments with us. Your children do so much at home and we want to hear all about those things that make you say 'Wow!'

<u>Year 1</u>

In Literacy this week in Year 1, the children have been making story boxes linked to the stories that they have been working on in their classes (Jack and the Beanstalk/ Jim and the Beanstalk). Once completed, they will use their story boxes as a stimulus to create their own stories.

In Jasper Class, the children were presented with a challenge by the Giant:-Do the tallest people have the biggest feet? This prompted a discussion about how they could solve the problem and lead to lots of measuring and comparing of lengths in centimetres using a tape measure. Moonstone Class have been estimating and comparing the weights of different objects.

Onyx class would like to say a huge thank you to Kerrie (Éala's mum) for reading the book *Princess Mirror-Belle*. The children thoroughly enjoyed story time and they were able to engage in a detailed discussion about the main story events. In preparation for the Phonics screening in June, please encourage your child to practise reading a range of books and reading materials during half term.

<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 had a fantastic time at the Museum of London! Children explored some of the museum interactive galleries and took part in a *Fire!Fire!* workshop where they were showed off their extensive knowledge about the Great Fire of London.

Both classes have been very creative this week and it's been a joy to watch children use their imagination in various subjects. Amethyst class worked hard on their *Twisted Tales* and Ruby class wrote and then made digital posters about some of the UK's endangered animals. Inspired by mini Grey's book *Biscuit Bear*, children designed and then baked some biscuit friends for the Bear. We hope they didn't run away!

Children might have caught a "baking bug" and if you'd like to bake with them and then share your results (photos will suffice!) after the half term break, we might even create a Year 2 recipe book.

We would like to wish you a very sunny and restful break.

<u>Year 3</u>

This week in maths, we have been recapping the learning we have covered so far in year 3. It is always important to recap learning and it would be very helpful if children were given the chance to go over their learning at home. In English this week, we have found out what happens in the rest of the story 'The tin forest' and we have continued to write our diary entries. We have focused on writing in first person, chronological order and using adverbials to start our sentences with. In Art, we used oil pastels to create a picture that shows the old man's dream from 'The tin forest'. We studied the techniques used by George Shipperley in his oil pastel paintings.

Year 4

Next term we will be focusing on our Enterprise project. The children will be learning about investment spending their personal money and budgeting. This will be supported by the children's understanding of working with decimals this term.

Just a little reminder about our home learning project for over the half term. As part of our topic this term we learned about how the shops and marketing has changed in Hither Green over time. We would like the children to imagine there is a vacant shop in our local area and design a shop to go there. We would like you to encourage the children to think about the purpose of the shop, the customers and what our local area needs.

We would like the children to prepare some form of presentation to share their shop with the class. This can be a poster, power point, model shop or just a short speech to share with their peers! We look forward to sharing these in the first week of term.

We will be learning to tell the time in maths next term and because we live in a digital world we sometimes find children are less confident with telling the time on an analogue clock. Please support your child in practising telling the time on an analogue clock over half term.

<u>Year 5</u>

Firstly, a huge thank you to all the parents/carers that helped and supported on the Tri-School Sports Day. We really appreciate your help and wouldn't be able to run activities outside of school without you.

On that note, we have a trip to the design museum in South Kensington on Monday 10th June (the second week back after half term). Letters will be going out on the first day, but if you are available to come with us on the visit, please keep the date free.

In English, the children have been writing a persuasive piece on whether animals should be used in space trials. In the class debate, they were able to get their opinions across clearly and this has helped with their final piece. Have a relaxing half term break!

<u>Year 6</u>

First of all, we'd like to thank all of the children for their effort during SATs week. They were incredibly focused, resilient and remained enthusiastic throughout all the assessments- they were pretty fearless during our trip to Chessington too!

This week, we've written diary entries based on the creation of Frankenstein's monster from the points of view of Dr Frankenstein and his creation. We've focused on changing formality and sentence structures to show the difference between both characters, as well as use rhetorical questions and emotive language to show their feelings. On Tuesday, we started to get the wheels in motion for our end of year production by holding auditions. Again, we were blown away by the confidence and stage presence of the children. All children should be aware of their roles by the end of the school week. We hope all of the children have a lovely, well-deserved half term break.
