

Autumn

Dear Parents/Carers of Year 1,

Welcome to Year 1! We're delighted how well the children have returned to school and are settling into their new class.

In this newsletter, we will tell you more about your child's learning this term in Year 1.

English

We start the school year with two wonderful books: '*We're Going on a Bear Hunt*,' by Michael Rosen and '*Nature Trail*,' by Benjamin Zephaniah. Children will explore these texts through drama, role-play and discussion. They will practise writing labels, captions and descriptions, progressing to simple sentences. Writing skills will be further developed as children learn to demarcate sentences correctly, using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces between words. These books will also support our learning in RE and science (the Natural World, Animals and Plants).

MFL

Our school target language is Spanish. Children will learn simple greetings and songs in the language. Listen out for them greeting you with 'Hola!'

Maths

Children will start the term comparing two sets of objects and will begin to use mathematical language such as *fewer* and *more* to compare. We will then move onto counting to 20, with a focus on understanding the numeric system to 20. Children will learn that a whole object can be split into two or more parts in many ways and will represent the relationship between numbers, using part-part-whole models. Using their knowledge of numbers, they will begin to solve simple addition and subtraction problems within 10.

Science

This half term, children will learn about Animals including Humans, and Plants. We will start by learning about ourselves – our body and senses. Many of our science activities will be practical; for example, children will use their five senses to explore sights, sounds, smells and textures in the indoor and outdoor environments. In addition, the theme of Seasonal Change runs throughout the year and this half term, we will explore Autumn changes in our immediate surroundings.

Geography

Beginning with ourselves and our location within Brindishe Green/Hither Green, we will focus on the geography of the local area. Children will develop a sense of place and will learn about the physical features of their local environment, as well as aspects of human geography, such as the ways in which the local community uses services in Hither Green. Children will make 'messy maps' of their classroom and use Google Earth to support their understanding of key locations.

Art

Exploring the theme. *Spirals*. Children will discover spiral patterns, using a variety of media, including natural materials in the outdoor environment. They will record their learning in a sketchbook.

PSHME

We will focus on the important issue of friendship. We understand that friendships mean a lot to children and our curriculum for PSHME will help them form positive relationships with peers and adults in school.

RE

Children will learn about the natural world and the Christian creation story.

Computing

Children will identify different forms of technology how they help us. They will learn to name different parts of a computer (screen, mouse, keyboard) and how to
