This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...

We learnt that a QR code means 'quick response'. It has black and white squares like a barcode and is scanned for information. We used them for mystery writing!

We studied the space race between America and the Soviet Union (Russia's old name).
They sent a dog named Laika into space. If it barked from space, they knew it was safe for us!

We enjoyed making newspapers about a book in which the moon goes missing! We used scales to find out the mass of objects, and also compared the UK with Ecuador.

Reception

This week, we had a visit related to the Victorians and we tried on a traditional Victorian woman's outfit - they had to wear a tight corset for as thin a waist as possible!

Year 1 Magnolia

We had a workshop in which we saw art and what kind of clothes they wore in the Stone Age. We also learnt that rock can be igneous, sedimentary or metamorphic.

Year 1 Sycamore

In Maths, we subtracted fractions with different denominators. We also made matchbox diaries in which we have to put some small item which has sentimental value.

Year 2

In Maths, we learnt the formula for the area of a triangle: ½base x height. We also created FAQs about Internet safety to educate everyone how to use technology safely.

Year 3

Our class have particularly enjoyed learning about Odysseus, a warrior king from Greece. His fight with the Cyclops showed that he was brave but arrogant.

Year 4

Alongside reading and spelling tests, we wrote pieces inspired by The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas: we are studying the Holocaust. It's a story about a family who live in Auschwitz...
