## UPDATE FROM THE BRINDISHE GOVERNING BODY

### **What an amazing community effort!**

As we approach the final days of this academic year, it's important to reflect on the way that the whole Brindishe community - staff, parents, carers, volunteers, local groups, businesses and residents – have worked and contributed to keep the children learning and achieving their very best in the most difficult of circumstances. On behalf of the Governing Body, I'd like to say a very heartfelt thank you to you all.

Not everything's been about the pandemic this year, and since summer 2020 governors and senior leaders have been working on a range of topics. **Here are just a few recent highlights:**

\*After much research, discussion – and a little bit of tasting - a new **school meals** provider has been selected and they will start in September. They're called Radish, and you'll be hearing lots about them as we hope you'll sign up for your children to try their dishes.

\*Brindishe Manor's nursery and reception children will be able to enjoy an **exciting new outside play and learning space** from the start of the new term. Their outside space has been due for an upgrade for a while, so it's wonderful to be able to approve this at last.

\*New link governors for Safeguarding, Health and Safety and Special Needs were appointed during the past year and have visited each school to make sure that our buildings are in a good and healthy condition, and that our **children are safe**. Link governors have also recently been appointed to the **individual schools** to work closely with the Headteacher and senior leaders, and advance the sense of individuality where appropriate to all governors.

\*A major focus for the GB this year has been to **recruit new governors** to fill several vacancies. It's important to get the right people with the right skills so that we can work effectively and efficiently. I'm pleased to say that we've been successful in recruiting Carolyn Unsted and Andrew Fiddy, both very experienced and skillful, and you can read more about them shortly on the governors page of your school website, together with pieces about the existing current governors. Our focus from September will be filling the remaining vacancies with governors who will help the GB better **reflect our diverse community**. If you know of someone who might be interested and is not currently a Brindishe parent or member of staff, do please let us know.

\*Finally, we're hoping that from September all full GB meetings will be able to be held in person, which means we can **welcome back observers**. ### PCR Testing

If you or your child are showing any symptoms of COVID-19, you must isolate as a family and book a PCR test on the following website: <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>

#### **WHEN SHOULD I HAVE A PCR TEST?**

- **If you currently have symptoms** that may indicate COVID-19, this is the test you should have to diagnose the infection.
- **If a lateral flow test is positive.** The purpose of the PCR test is to confirm the diagnosis, since it is a more accurate test than the lateral flow test.

#### **WHEN SHOULD I HAVE A LATERAL FLOW TEST?**

- You should only have this test **if you don't have any symptoms** and have been invited to take one as part of an exercise to identify infected people without symptoms.
